"From July 1 onwards, the WRC rules change to allow a choice of three different compounds for gravel rallies, two of which must be nominated prior to the start. For Rally Finland's fast but relatively unabrasive stages, our choice is the medium [M6] and soft [S6] Michelin LTX Force. The new S6 et M6 [17/65x15] were developed

by Michelin Motorsport's engineers and were tested and approved by all of Michelin's partners before the rally. All our WRC partners were given the opportunity to test it before Finland. Rally Finland has been a mainstay of the WRC since 1973. Its incredible jumps and high speeds make it one of the most spectacular rounds of the season!"

MICHELIN TYRES FOR THE 2018 RALLY FINLAND

A new regulation introduced from Rally Finland allows the availability of three tyre compounds for gravel rounds (soft, medium, hard). Two must be nominated prior to the start of each rally (Finland: soft and medium)

MICHELIN AND RALLY FINLAND

**Michelin has won Rally Finland
26 TIMES**

Michelin won the fastest ever Rally Finland (average speed: 126.6kph) **with Kris Meeke** (Citroën DS3 WRC) **in 2016**

Michelin won Rally Finland for the first time in 1982 with Audi and four-wheel drive technology

Nine Flying Finns have won Rally Finland with Michelin (Mikkola, Vatanen, Salonen, Alén, Kankkunen, Mäkinen, Grönholm, Latvala, Lappi)

Michelin won its first Rally Finland stage in 1980 (Kullang, Opel Ascona)

Michelin has since won 649 Rally Finland stages

Michelin notched up its 200th WRC victory in Finland in 2003

RALLY FINLAND TRIVIA

Rally Finland was a round of the inaugural WRC in 1973.

This is its 45th running as a WRC round

Hannu Mikkola and Marcus Grönholm have both won Rally Finland
seven times

The 12 fastest rounds in WRC history all took place in Finland

Over the years, Rally Finland has been known as Jyväskylän Surat
(Jyväskylä Grand Prix) and the 1000 Lakes Rally

Carlos Sainz was the first 'Latin' driver to win Rally Finland (in 1990)

The 2012 Rally Finland was the 500th WRC round

The term Flying Finns originally applied to Finnish track athletes like
Paavo Nurmi. Rauno Aaltonen was rallying's first Flying Finn

RALLY FINLAND INFO

Jyväskylä, situated in Finland's lake district, is a university city
(30,000 students)

The 187,888 lakes that Finland boasts are a legacy of the ice cap
which covered the country 10,000 years ago

Rally Finland coincides with the end of the summer holiday
for Finnish schoolchildren

The Alvar Aalto Museum (named after the country's famed
architect and designer) is in Jyväskylä

The Finnish flag (light blue cross on a white background)
was chosen 100 years ago

Finland is not in Scandinavia which comprises Sweden,
Norway and Denmark

DOWN MEMORY LANE

The 1988 1000 Lakes Rally – Markku's last home triumph



It was 30 years ago that Markku 'Maximum Attack' Alén collected his sixth and last Rally Finland win driving a Michelin-equipped Lancia Delta Integrale. A French youngster named Didier Auriol starred on the same event.

After winning the 1000 Lakes Rally in 1976, 1978, 1979 and 1980 driving a Fiat 131 Abarth, Markku Alén steered the new Group A Lancia Delta to victory on the same event in 1987. He consequently started the 1998 rally – which attracted a record field of 195 starters – as one of the clear favourites.

The event quickly turned into a duel between Alén and fellow Finn Juha Kankkunen. Together, they monopolised the first 22 fastest stage times and traded the lead no fewer than six times before the latter was betrayed by engine failure on SS33.

After that, Alén – who never won the world title – was able to cruise home in the rain to collect his sixth home victory. It would be his last success in Jyväskylä, however, and his last-but-one WRC win.

The other star of the 1988 Rally Finland was French youngster Didier Auriol who succeeded in mixing it with the local experts in his Ford/Michelin to finish on the podium, a result which earned him a job with the factory Lancia squad.

WRC TYRE-RELATED REGULATIONS

- ✓ The FIA has registered three different tyre manufacturers for the 2018 WRC: Michelin, DMack and Pirelli
- ✓ Car manufacturers must register the tyre brand they have chosen with the FIA
- ✓ Only moulded tyres are authorised
- ✓ Tyres must be identifiable by a barcode and RFID chip
- ✓ Re-cutting or otherwise modifying the tread pattern is not permitted
- ✓ Only marked tyres are allowed to be used on stages
- ✓ Tyre pre-heating systems are prohibited
- ✓ Cars may carry up to two spares
- ✓ Tyres may only be inflated using air
- ✓ Only one type of dry-weather asphalt tyre (same construction and pattern) and two compound options are authorised for the season (a third compound option is allowed for the Rallye Monte-Carlo)
- ✓ Just one type of asphalt rain tyre is authorised
- ✓ Only one type of gravel tyre (same construction and pattern) and three compound options (from Rally Finland onwards) are authorised for the season (two compounds to be nominated prior to each event)
- ✓ A single type of snow/ice tyre (one compound only) to be fitted to 7x15-inch rims
- ✓ A single 'joker' change is allowed per manufacturer in the course of the season
- ✓ Tyre quotas per event for priority drivers are calculated on the basis of four tyres per tyre-change opportunity (plus four tyres for shakedown)
