#### Manager, Michelin Motorsport's WRC Programme

"Like the Monte Carlo, Sweden and Finland, Rally GB is a WRC classic. This year it is being held for the 74th time in total, and for the 45th time as a world championship round. Its slot in the calendar is three weeks earlier this season. At the beginning of October, the conditions might be drier than usual and therefore harder-wearing.

That's why we have nominated the medium-compound Michelin LTX Force M6 as the prime choice for the WRC crews. If it rains, or if the stages are muddy, the softcompound LTX Force S6 could well be used for the first time in Wales."

#### MICHELIN AND RALLY GB

Michelin won Britain's round of the WRC (RAC Rally) for the first time in 1980 with Toivonen/White (Talbot Lotus)

Michelin has won Rally GB 16 times

From 1973 to 1979, Michelin only won two RAC Rally stages!

In contrast, Michelin runners won all 35 stages in 1993

Michelin has won Rally GB with nine different Finnish drivers

(Toivonen, Mikkola, Vatanen, Salonen, Alèn, Airikkala, Kankkunen, Grönholm and Latvala)















Event brought forward by three weeks compared with 2017

Return of the spectacular Great Orme asphalt stage (8.03km) which ends in the streets of Llandudno

Sunday morning's Power Stage is not the last stage of the rally

Slate Mountain in the Snowdonia Mountains is a new super-special

Clocaenog, Brenig, Gwydir and Sweet Lamb have all been modified

Myherin is identical to 2017

Dyfi and Gartheiniog have been shortened compared with 2017

Elsi and Pneumachno are new stages

Leg 2 lasts 14 hours, with the morning's service at 5:30am!

Wales Rally GB doesn't visit England this year

#### RALLY GB TRIVIA

Formerly known as the RAC Rally, Rally GB first counted towards the FIA World Rally
Championship in 1973

It shares the record of being a WRC round for the 45th time with Rally Finland

The inaugural event (1932) was won by Colonel A.H. Loughborough in a Lanchester 15/18

Hannu Mikkola, Petter Solberg and Sébastien Ogier share the record for the highest number of Rally GB wins (4)

21 different drivers have won Rally GB since 1973

10 years ago, the 2008 Rally GB was the shortest round of the WRC with just 282.35 competitive kilometres

Ford has won Rally GB 12 times, including a run of seven in a row (1973 to 1979) with the Ford Escort RS

#### WALES RALLY GB INFO

There have been two Welsh world champion co-drivers:
Phil Mills (2003, with Petter Solberg) and David Richards (1981, with Ari Vatanen)

The service park is based in the grounds of Toyota's Deeside plant

Surf Snowdonia is an artificial lake in Dolgarrog, North Wales, where it is possible to surf

The new Slate Mountain super-special in Snowdonia Park takes place near former slate quarries

Newtown sits on the River Severn, the United Kingdom's longest river (354km)

Great Orme, a rocky headland near the seaside resort, Llandudno, is named after the Old Norse for sea serpent

Llanfairpwllgwyngyllgogerychwyrndrobwllllantysiliogogogoch, on the island of Anglesey, near Llandudno, is the European village with the longest name

#### 1998 Rally GB: Cliff-hanger!

Carlos Sainz missed out on a third world crown and left Finland's Tommi Mäkinen to claim a third straight title after a dramatic finish to the 1998 Rally GB. The event was won by Richard Burns (Mitsubishi/Michelin).

The rally started with two-time world champions

Tommi Mäkinen (Mitsubishi/Michelin) and Carlos Sainz (Toyota/Michelin) split by just two points in the Drivers' title chase.

When the Finn clouted a concrete block and ripped off the rear-right suspension of his Mitsubishi Lancer on Day 1's Silverstone spectator stage, all Sainz had to do to top the 1998 standings was finish inside the top four.

At the start of the season's final stage (Margam, 27.09km), the Spaniard was effectively sitting fourth overall. Just 300 metres from the finish line, however, his Toyota Corolla WRC was side-lined by engine failure. Mäkinen learnt that he was the 1998 world champion when someone phoned him with the news back at his hotel!

The rally was won by Briton Richard Burns (Mitsubishi Lancer/Michelin), ahead of Juha Kankkunen and Bruno Thiry (Ford Escort/Michelin).

#### WRC TYRE-RELATED REGULATIONS

- ✓ The FIA has registered three different tyre manufactures for the 2018 WRC: Michelin, DMack and Pirelli
- Car manufacturers must register the tyre brand they have chosen with the FIA
- ✓ Only moulded tyres are authorised
- ✓ Tyres must be identifiable by a barcode and RFID chip
- Re-cutting or otherwise modifying the tread pattern is not permitted
- ✓ Only marked tyres are allowed to be used on stages
- ✓ Tyre pre-heating systems are prohibited
- ✓ Cars may carry up to two spares
- ✓ Tyres may only be inflated using
- ✓ Only one type of dry-weather asphalt tyre (same construction and pattern) and two compound options are authorised for the season (a third compound option is allowed for the Rallye Monte-Carlo)
- Just one type of asphalt rain tyre is authorised
- ✓ Only one type of gravel tyre (same construction and pattern) and three compound options (from Rally Finland onwards) are authorised for the season (two compounds to be nominated prior to each event)
- ✓ A single type of snow/ice tyre (one compound only) to be fitted to 7x15-inch rims
- A single 'joker' change is allowed per manufacturer in the course of the season
- Tyre quotas per event for priority drivers are calculated on the basis of four tyres per tyre-change opportunity (plus four tyres for shakedown)
