Michelin has won the Rallye Monte-Carlo 28 times as a WRC round since 1973

"The Rallye Monte-Carlo is undoubtedly the toughest round of the WRC due to the unpredictable grip levels you get on the stages which make it an event where tyres really play a big role. It may not be all that demanding as an asphalt event, but the wintry conditions make it highly complex and tyre choices can be extremely difficult. The drivers need to be on their toes from start to finish to adapt to the presence or otherwise of running water, snow, frost and ice. Once again, tyre choices and tyre performance are sure to be major talking points."

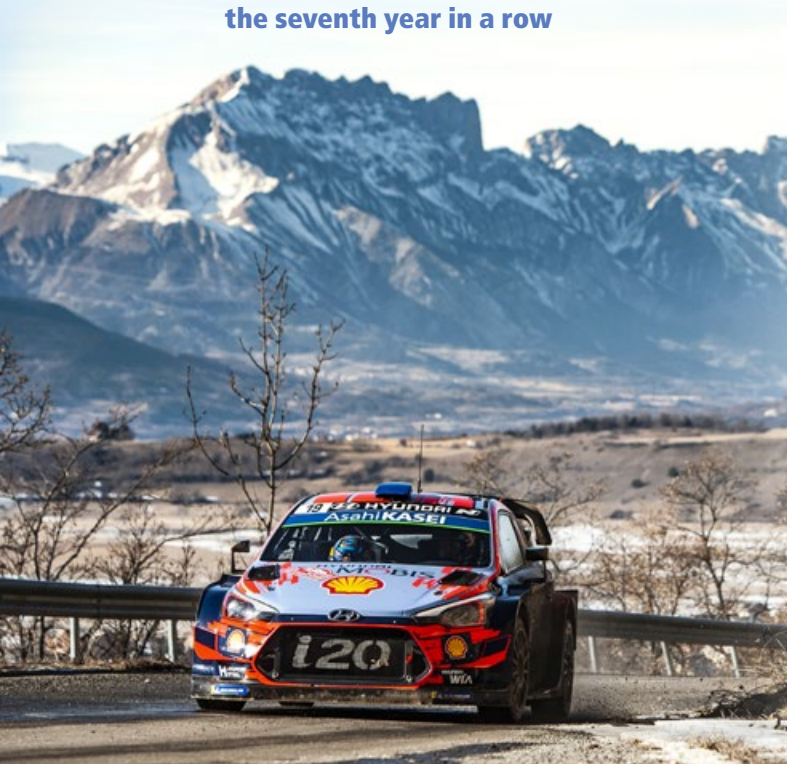
The Rallye Monte-Carlo is the world's
