TCR Australia confirms MICHELIN as tyre supplier, race formats for 2019

SYDNEY 19/11/2018: MICHELIN has been chosen as the inaugural control tyre supplier for the new TCR Australia category from 2019.

TCR Australia confirmed a multi-year tyre supply deal, as well as a number of key race regulations ahead its highly-anticipated maiden championship next year.

Michelin is no stranger to TCR Series worldwide, acting as the official tyre supplier for the two opening seasons of TCR International in 2015/2016. Along with the TCR Australia championship, the global performance giant is also the tyre of choice for TCR Asia, China, Scandinavia, Thailand and the Spanish Endurance Championships exclusively.

At the media launch, TCR Australia also confirmed the intentions for its race regulations that will be the focus of teams during its inaugural seven round championship. All TCR Australia rounds will be held under sprint race formats, with three races per weekend making up the preliminary regulations.

TCR Australia will be run alongside the Shannons Nationals, taking in all seven rounds of the official CAMS-backed championship. All four TCR Series cars that have arrived in Australia – Audi, Honda, VW and Hyundai – are testing at Sydney Motorsport Park today, with potential competitors and media getting immersed in TCR.

On the announcement of the Michelin partnership, Australian Racing Group, Director, Matt Braid said, "We are very pleased to announce a prestigious and world-renowned brand such as Michelin to be our official tyre supplier to TCR Australia from next year," said Matt Braid.

"There was significant interest in the control tyre supply agreement for the category, and we feel very privileged to have Michelin as our inaugural tyre partner.

"The decision to select Michelin as the tyre supplier was based on their experience in Asian and European TCR competition, their comprehensive level of support they are able to provide on and off track, and their intention to use TCR Australia series in their consumer marketing activities."

Patrick Dias, Michelin Motorsports Director for Asia-Pacific, said: "We are very excited about partnering with the TCR Australia category and vehicle manufacturers that serve it. We use motorsport as a laboratory for our tyre development. The data collected during races allows engineers to work on new technologies which are carried over to our road tyres."

First of all, TCR's international status provides Michelin with visibility not only in the world's mature markets, such as Europe, but also in the fast-emerging markets of South America and southern Asia."
