"The RallyRACC Catalunya is the world championship's only mixed gravel/asphalt round. As a result, it is a little more complex for us in terms of logistics since we take more than 2,000 tyres, with five different types available for our WRC partners. In fact, the drivers have a bigger choice for Catalonia than they do for the Monte Carlo! This year's longest dirt stage is La Fatarella-Vilalba which has been extended by 12 kilometres to

38.85km. It is being run in the opposite direction to 2017, but there is still the long asphalt portion in the middle which can see big gaps develop. Sébastien Loeb is back for this event which he has won eight times. As if the weekend wasn't going to be interesting enough, his presence will obviously add to the excitement!"

THE RALLYRACC CATALUNYA

The RallyRACC Catalunya first appeared on the WRC calendar in 1991

Since 2010, the RallyRACC Catalunya has been the championship's only mixedsurface round

The mechanics have 75 minutes on Friday evening to convert the cars from gravel- to asphalt-specification

Prior to 1991, the RallyRACC Catalunya was known as the Rallye Catalunya Costa Brava which counted towards the European Rally Championship

In 1982, competitors tackled three different types of surface, namely dirt, asphalt... and snow which fell in quantity at the end of November!

Since 1997, French drivers (Auriol, Panizzi, Bugalski, Loeb, Ogier) have won this event 16 times!

Spaniard Carlos Sainz (18 participations) has started the RallyRACC Catalunya more times than any other driver.

Citroën has won the RallyRACC Catalunya 10 times

Sébastien Loeb made his WRC debut on the 1999 RallyRACC Catalunya with Michelin

RALLYRACC CATALUNYA TRIVIA

The seaside resort of Salou and the PortAventura theme park have hosted the RallyRACC's HQ every year since 2005

Inaugurated in 1995, PortAventura is Europe's third-biggest theme park

The first day visits gravel stages near the 928-km-long Rio Ebro, Spain's most powerful river and the scene of the Battala del Ebro 80 years ago in 1938

Day 2's stages take place near the UNESCO-listed city of Tarragona

The Barcelona super-special passes the Montjuic district's Magic Fontain and four different palaces

After the Monte Carlo, Tour de Corse, Sardinia and Turkey, the RallyRACC Catalunya is the fifth 'Mediterranean' round of the season!

DOWN MEMORY LANE

Toyota/Michelin's Catalonia one-two in 1998



Prior to last month's Rally Turkey, Toyota/ Michelin's most recent one-two finish in the WRC dated back to the 1998 Rallye Catalunya-Costa Brava, with Didier Auriol and Freddy Loix.

Spain's WRC qualifier in 1998 was an all-asphalt affair. It was Round 5 of the season and based in Lloret del Mar on the Costa Brava coast north of

Barcelona. Leg 2 visited the Tarragona region and featured stages like Santa Marina which are still run today.

Toyota Team Europe's line-up consisted of Michelin-equipped Corolla WRCs for Carlos Sainz, Freddy Loix and Didier Auriol. Due to a difficult start to the season, the latter wasn't nominated to score Manufacturers' points and the team would soon regret that decision since the Frenchman emerged in front after SS2. Aided by eight fastest times, he went on to lead all the way to the finish.

That said, the 1994 world champion faced stiff opposition from rivals competing in the two-litre/two-wheel drive class, like Panizzi and Delecour (Peugeot 306 Maxi), and Bugalski and Puras (Citroën Xsara Kit-Car). These two cars were making their maiden world class appearances but the all-wheel drive machines prevailed to win the day.

A late charge by Belgium's Freddy Loix succeeded in clinching a one-two finish for the Toyota Corolla WRC, ahead of the new Mitsubishi Evo Vs of Mäkinen and Burns.

WRC TYRE-RELATED REGULATIONS

- ✓ The FIA has registered three different tyre manufactures for the 2018 WRC: Michelin, DMack and Pirelli
- Car manufacturers must register the tyre brand they have chosen with the FIA
- ✓ Only moulded tyres are authorised
- ✓ Tyres must be identifiable by a barcode and RFID chip
- Re-cutting or otherwise modifying the tread pattern is not permitted
- ✓ Only marked tyres are allowed to be used on stages
- ✓ Tyre pre-heating systems are prohibited
- ✓ Cars may carry up to two spares
- ✓ Tyres may only be inflated using
- ✓ Only one type of dry-weather asphalt tyre (same construction and pattern) and two compound options are authorised for the season (a third compound option is allowed for the Rallye Monte-Carlo)
- Just one type of asphalt rain tyre is authorised
- ✓ Only one type of gravel tyre (same construction and pattern) and three compound options (from Rally Finland onwards) are authorised for the season (two compounds to be nominated prior to each event)
- ✓ A single type of snow/ice tyre (one compound only) to be fitted to 7x15-inch rims
- A single 'joker' change is allowed per manufacturer in the course of the season
- Tyre quotas per event for priority drivers are calculated on the basis of four tyres per tyre-change opportunity (plus four tyres for shakedown)
