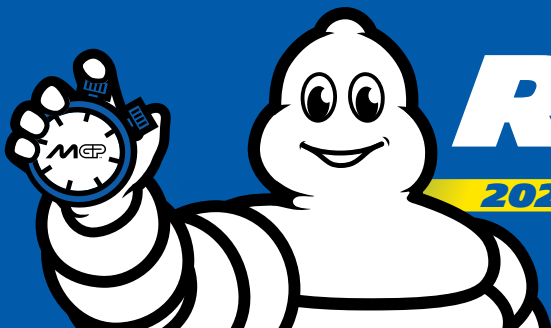

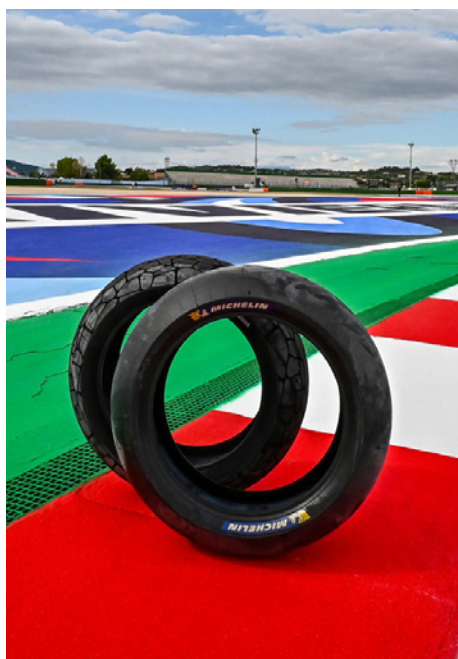
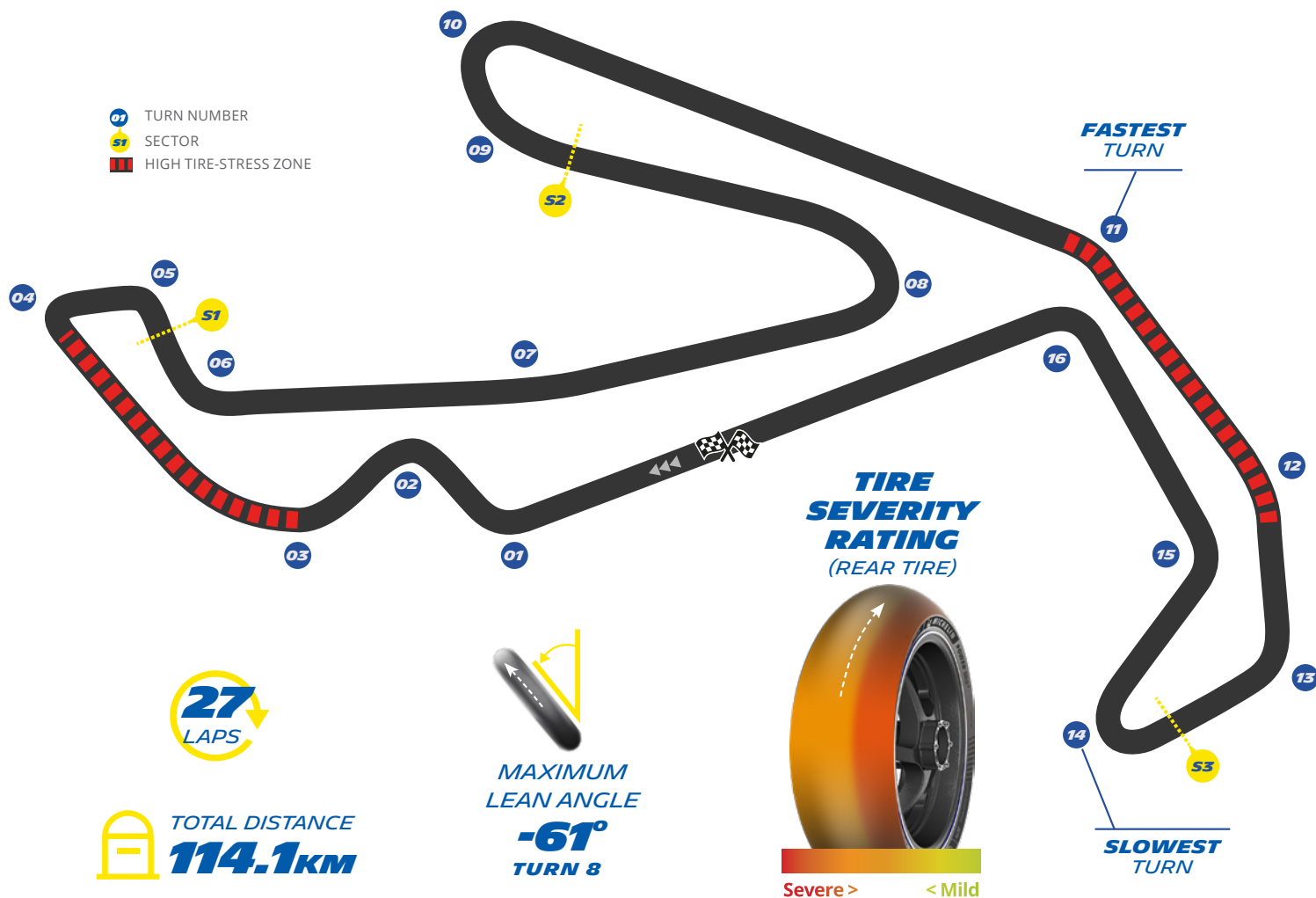

Misano is a circuit we know very well, as it is used year-round for private testing. We therefore have a wealth of data, which allows us to arrive with a perfectly tailored tire allocation. We decided to adopt the same approach as on other recent circuits such as Balaton and Barcelona: a symmetrical Soft and Medium at the front, and a Hard combining the stiffest casing with the Medium compound. This choice provides the ideal balance between consistency, stability, and rider feedback.

At the rear, we stick with the Soft and Medium specifications that proved highly satisfactory last year. They are asymmetrical, with a reinforced right shoulder, essential at Misano given its ten right-hand corners. This circuit is less severe on tires than Barcelona: the asphalt offers better natural grip, top speed and average speeds are lower, and there is no elevation. But Misano remains demanding on the front, particularly in sections like Curvone or Tramonto, where the precision and stability of the front tire are crucial.

We expect a closely contested weekend, with mild weather and an exceptional atmosphere thanks to the passion of the fans. And on Monday, we will be back on track for an official test with our partners, as part of the ongoing preparation for next season. It is always a valuable moment to fine-tune settings and confirm that our range is ready to meet the challenges ahead.

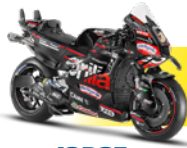

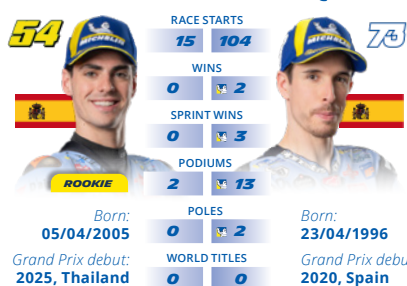

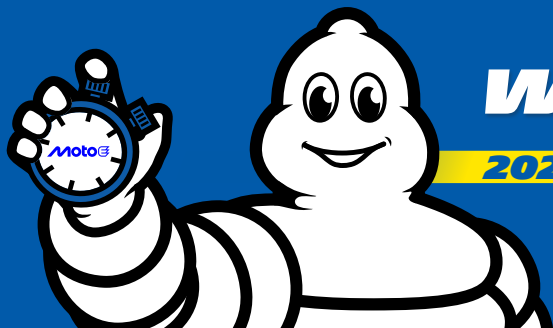

2025 FIM MotoE™



Michelin has been the sole tire supplier for the MotoE™ World Championship since its inception in 2019. It offers a unique environment for innovation, helping the Group speed up the integration of renewable or recycled materials in its tires and expand its knowledge of electric mobility — ultimately supporting faster development of its commercial product lines.

This year, Michelin's development teams achieved a historic milestone with **MotoE™ tires incorporating an average of 57% renewable or recycled materials** (58% front, 56% rear).

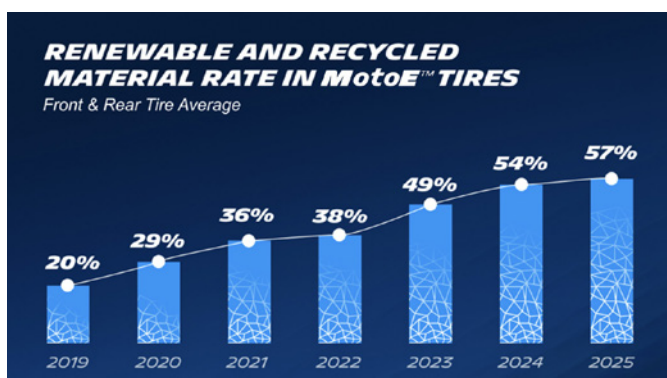
The MotoE™ tires feature a broad spectrum of **renewable and recycled materials**, including natural rubber from hevea tree sap, recycled carbon black from end-of-life tires (via pyrolysis by partner company Enviro), limonene resin from orange and lemon peels, rayon from wood cellulose, sunflower oil, recycled steel from scrap metal (via electric arc furnace by partner Global Steel Wire).

In 2025, Michelin integrates 57% renewable and recycled materials into its MotoE™ tires — while improving performance without increasing environment impact

MotoE™ Tires with a New Look Reflecting the Group's Ambition: The All-Sustainable Tire

After the rear tire in 2024, both the front and rear tires now feature the special livery, which has been slightly revised this year to extend over the sidewalls. This unique design, called Race to Vision, is directly inspired by the VISION Concept — a symbol of Michelin's sustainable tire development model looking ahead to 2050.

This design is reserved for tires that exceed 50% renewable and recycled content.

- In the case that Q1 and Q2 sessions are both declared wet by the Race Director, the extra tires allocated will be rain tires.
- In the case that Q1 and Q2 sessions are declared as different weather conditions then no extra tire will be allocated.

QUALIFYING PRACTICE

Q1: the slowest 10 riders from the combined results of practice.

Q2: the fastest 8 riders from the combined results of practice plus the fastest 2 riders from Q1.

RACE

Riders will complete one sighting lap before taking their position on the grid. There is no warm up lap, once the grid preparations have finished, the red light will go out and the race starts. Tire warmers may be used on the grid. Charging of the battery on the grid is permitted.

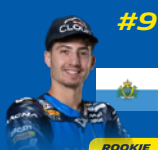
